I then told everyone to line up so we can start practice and just be ready to go once he got there and not waste time. Also, the pep talks and cheers I would do and lead before a game. A great description of leadership indeed, but Mandujano's passion for improving herself and those around her reaches beyond the soccer field. She has often encouraged students to apply for scholarships and has urged them to apply for any scholarship they can find; not just by speaking, but by doing. 
Death Forest



the 9th of January the Democratic



party gathered enough votes for the senate to debate on whether they should bring back the net neutrality rules that were removed. There are 49 democrats and 51 republicans in the senate: senator Charles Schumer declares on Tuesday that all 49 democrats voted to bring back the net neutrality rules along with one republican. If

the democrats do get that vote they will restore Obama-era rules on internet service projects. Unfortunately even if the bill is passed by the senate it will be a while before it can actually become a law, the bill will also need to get the majority of votes in the hose where the republicans have more seats and finally the bill would need to be signed by the 45th president who unfortunately has the power to veto it.



Learn About Your Sleeping Habits

Sleep is composed of many parts, such as the following; the importance of sleep, the different types of sleeping disorders, stages of sleep, and different types of dreams.

What's sleep? Sleep is a condition of body and mind that recurs for several hours every night, nervous system is relatively inactive, consciousness is suspended. Many people ask why sleep is important, well sleep is essential for a person's health and well-being, yet millions of people lack sleep (sleep deprivation). An individual's need for sleep varies, but the consequences of not getting enough sleep can include drug, tobacco, alcohol abuse, nightmares, and sleep terrors. Sleep deprivation can also cause hallucinations. Beginning to hallucinate is among the more common symptoms. Sleep deprivation can actually cause symptoms that mimic mental illness's, such as disorientation and paranoid thoughts. Almost half the population doesn't get enough sleep, 40% of the people sleep less than the recommended 7-9 hours at night (teenagers and children need more). Only 5% of people sleep more than nine hours a night.

Sleep deprivation is a sleeping disorder. Sleep deprivation is something most teenagers suffer from. Most teenagers in high school sleep 6 -7 ½ hours. However we need 9 - 9 1/2 hours of sleep. 90% of high school students are sleep deprived. High school students demand on their time from hectic social activities, jobs, homework, family obligations, and sleep less. Other sleeping disorders are Jet lag - a disorder that can affect those who travel quickly across multiple time zones. Narcolepsy - it causes overwhelming daytime drowsiness.

Night terror - having multiple nightmares.

Sleeping also has different stages.

Stage 1 - intro to sleep. Your eyes stay open, and muscles begin to relax.

Stage 2 - beginning of sleep. Light, dreamless sleep.

Stage 3&4 - Slow wave sleep. Deep sleep.

Rem - Rapid eye movement.

Sleep also has different types of dreams.

Daydreams - 70 - 120 minutes of their waking day.

Lucid dreams - is where you're self aware and able to control your dream.

Nightmares - evoke fear, anxiety, or sadness causing (rem) rapid eye movement.

Recurring dreams - dreams trying to tell you something, similar to healing dreams.

Prophetic dreams - you see the future in your dream.

Signal dreams - helps you to solve problems or make decisions in your waking life.

New Mexico is the fourth dangerous state in the United States and Albuquerque was the 5th most dangerous city in the nation. The people of Albuquerque are complaining saying "It will never change and people are getting tired of it." The crime is definitely making our state look bad. In 2013 there was 123 murders, In 2014 there was 101 murders, and even two years later in 2016 it had 139 murders more than the years before. There was even a mass shooting at a High School in Northern New Mexico that murdered three people including two students and the attacker.

The tournament will involve 32 national teams. A total of 64 matches will be played in 12 different venues located in 11 different cities. The final of 2017, was contested by Venezuela and England. England won the match 1–0, winning the title for the first time.
